## **CONTACT US**

\*There is now a simple “Contact Us” form on the IUP Landing page.

\*We still encourage users to use the Forums for most questions.

## **REGISTRATION→SUBSCRIPTION**

\*There is no formal registration. You can simply complete a subscription form if you want to stay in contact with us.

- If you have registered on the old website and agreed to receive communications from us, you are automatically in our new IUP contact list.

## **MATERIAL REQUESTS: LOGIN and REQUEST→REQUEST ONLY**

\*No need to login when requesting materials.

- Some materials can be accessed immediately (like the RISC-V Guide)

- Controlled materials have a much simpler request form. Please be generous with your information. Providing an academic or organisation e-mail helps us a lot in assessing your request.

- Under the old system, once approved, the link expired in 3 days, and could not be re-activated. Download approvals now last 7 days. And, if the link expires, you can now submit a new request.

- When you make your first request through the new system, it uses the e-mail address you gave as a User Name and asks you to set-up a download password. Then you can access the download. This can be used for all your subsequent requests.

## **FORUMS**

\*All the useful posts are still there. The original “knowledgebase” has been migrated.

- The Forum works the same way as before. Register as a user, and then you can post.

- All posts are moderated. We check for new posts every day and assign our authors to give answers.
